<u>Exploration Station, Lumberton & Golden Corral, Buffet & Catering of Lumberton</u> Launch "Read To Succeed"

Lumberton, NC - On Monday, August 9 Exploration Station, a non-profit children's hands-on learning center, is partnering with Golden Corral, Buffet & Catering of Lumberton in launching "Read To Succeed". Read To Succeed is a program designed to encourage and reward children, ages 4-12, to read. The launch will take place at Exploration Station located at 104 North Chestnut Street, in downtown historic Lumberton, from 11:30a.m. – 1:00p.m. Golden Corral of Lumberton's Catering Services will provide lite refreshments, all are welcome.

Stacie Kinlaw, Executive Director, Exploration Station explained the program, "Read To Succeed consists of a Reading Record Bookmark to record a child's reading of 10 books and a verifying signature. The Bookmark can then be redeemed at an Exploration Station's monthly Story-time for an Achievement Certificate, good for a Free Kid's Buffet Meal at Golden Corral, Buffet & Catering of Lumberton. As part of the Read To Succeed program Golden Corral has also agreed to sponsor Exploration Station's monthly Story-times by providing refreshments, newspaper announcements, posters, and bookmarks. The Read To Succeed program will run from August 2010 through May 2011."

Mrs. Kinlaw went on to explain the added value of Exploration Station's partnership with Golden Corral of Lumberton, "Through this partnership with Golden Corral, we will be able to reach beyond the doors of Exploration Station to encourage reading in young children through partnering with local area schools and increased marketing power, materials, and resources. The children of our area will reap the benefits of learning through increased reading, opportunities for achievement and recognition, and experience the magic of learning at Exploration Station Hands On Learning Center.

READING is an important foundation to learning which is key to the mission of Exploration Station - to provide learning opportunities for children. This reward based program to encourage children to read more is a new valuable program offering at Exploration Station. We are still identifying potential schools and venues to provide the tools and materials to grow and stretch our reach to the community which is a great opportunity for us.

Exploration Station's History & Neat Facts:

- 1) We are located in the building across from the library with flying pig figures affixed to the roof. The folk art pigs were designed and created by local artists, the Ferros out of St. Pauls, NC. These designs were chosen because when the idea for a children's museum in Robeson County first was born, it seemed impossible like the old saying "when pigs fly" well, PIGS HAVE BEEN FLYING in downtown Lumberton since 2000, for almost 10 years!!! Doors opened in September of 2000
- 2) In 1999, a Board of Directors, made up of members from the Robeson County Public Library Board of Trustees, the Friends of the Library, BB&T, the Partnership for Children and the Lumberton Junior Service League, began plans for a children's museum and almost immediately began the process to become a non-profit organization, called The Children's Place of Robeson, INC. The chairman of this founding committee was Dr. Mary Ann Masters and the first Director was Myra McLees.
- 3) In 1999, most of the funds used to build and staff this new endeavor were provided through Smart Start and BB&T grants paired with generous donations from local community members and groups including Southeastern Regional Medical Center, the Kiwanis and the Carr Gibson Family. The local Smart Start Board funded Exploration Station in the expectation that it would be a great asset for Robeson County and a wonderful learning experience for children and so it has for 10 YEARS!!!
- 4) Mission Statement Exists to enrich the lives of children, youth, families, teachers, and childcare providers by providing unique hands on learning experiences.
- 5) GOALS Our overall goals for Exploration Station are:
 - a. To expose children and their families to hands on learning experiences
 - b. To offer educational training and learning for parents, children, families, childcare providers and teachers
 - c. To provide experiences for school readiness
- 6) Exploration Station is continually supported financially by the city of Lumberton, County of Robeson, and Robeson County Partnership for Children, civic and community organizations like Kiwanis and the Lumberton Junior Service League, BUT we still rely heavily on philanthropic donations from businesses and individuals in our community.
- 7) Exploration Station houses 12 interactive exhibit areas where children learn through creative and imaginative play. Each area is designed around a theme including a school house, hospital, bank, fire station, grocery store, farm house, water works, and much more!

- 8) The children's museum is open to the public on Tuesdays through Saturdays; We are open late on Thursdays until 8 pm to provide opportunity for families to visit after work. General Admission is \$3.00 per child and \$1.00 per adult. We offer the opportunity for families to purchase annual family memberships for \$60/year that allow entry into the museum throughout the year plus discounts on programs and activities throughout the year
- 9) Current programming includes monthly Friday Night Kids Kamps, weekly Storytimes on Tuesdays at 11 am, Art Classes, Kraft Days, monthly Family Story Hours, Summer Camp Programs and much more!
- 10) FEATURED Fundraising effort One of our longstanding members of Exploration Station, the family of Maggie Underwood, parents are Tanya and David, have challenged ALL Members and Friends of Exploration Station to give a donation of \$10 this year in honor of the 10th Birthday for Exploration Station. Donors will have the opportunity to help us fill our money tree with GREEN!!! For each donation of \$10, they can create their own custom MONEY to hang on our tree at the Station. - 11) We are located at 104 N Chestnut Street in downtown Lumberton across the street from the Robeson County Public Library.


